NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING - Appeal No. 863 - Application for Special Use Permit

at 195 Mott Road, Gansevoort, NY 12831 (tax map no. 91.-1-29.1)

Pursuant to §149-29 of the regulations for consideration of a special use permit, notice is hereby given that the Zoning Board of Appeals of the Town of Moreau will conduct a public hearing on Wednesday, April 24, 2024, at 7:01pm in the Town Office Building, 351 Reynolds Road, Moreau, NY to hear all parties for or against the consideration of a special use permit requested by Michael Music (applicant). The applicant is seeking to establish up to 10 recreational vehicle/camping/cabin sites on a 43± acre parcel at 195 Mott Rd. in the Town of Moreau. The sites are planned to be built over two phases spanning a three-year period from 2024 through 2026. The cabins will consist of portable structures of varying themes and will be positioned at varying locations across the parcel. The intention is to provide a unique secluded camping experience for the users of the campground. The campsites will be supported by an on-site access drive, potable well, and septic system. Such campground facilities represent a land use that is subject to issuance of a permit for special use from the Town Zoning Board of Appeals.
