

**Judge Alden has Court on Wednesdays opposite of Judge McCabe**

Summary Proceedings to evict and recover property and Small Claims, which need to be scheduled, in advance, begin on Wednesdays at 2:00PM and start immediately after Vehicle and Traffic Court.

Criminal Court is at 9:00am and Traffic Court starts at 2:00pm prior to Small Claims and Summary Proceedings to evict and recover property.

**Judge McCabe has Court on Wednesdays opposite of Judge Alden.**

Summary Proceedings to evict and recover property and Small Claims, which need to be scheduled, in advance, begin on Wednesdays at 2:00PM and start immediately after Vehicle and Traffic Court.

Criminal Court is at 9:00am and Traffic Court starts at 2:00pm prior to Small Claims and Summary Proceedings to evict and recover property.

The Moreau Town Court is a part of the Unified Court System of the State of New York, and has jurisdiction over civil actions, such as small claims up to \$3000.00, evictions etc. Criminal cases, violations of Town of Moreau Ordinances and vehicle and traffic offenses occurring in the

Town of Moreau Town Justices are elected to 4 year terms.

Court Clerks perform administrative and clerical work in maintaining Court records. Court Clerks are there to be as helpful as possible, but they cannot give legal advice and have no authority to reduce or dismiss charges or alter fines, set by the Judges.

**Meeting with the Judge:**

Within the limits of Standards of Judicial Conduct, neither Judge is allowed to give any legal advice to anyone about any active case in the US, including cases involved in the Moreau Court.

**Prosecutor:**

The Office of the Saratoga County District Attorney, prosecutes all criminal cases and vehicle and traffic cases within the County of Saratoga. The ADA or Assistant District Attorney is only in Moreau Court when Court is in session. You may contact the Court for the procedure to follow in handling a traffic ticket by mail. All criminal cases, including Traffic Misdemeanors, require a personal appearance, by the defendant.
