CONCESSION STAND BIDS

Councilman Vittengl reported that one bid was received for the expansion and remodel of the concession stand in the Harry J. Betar Jr. Recreational Park and that bid was from R & J Kerr in the amount of \$110,000.00.

Councilman Vittengl explained that some of the proposed changes are; new bathrooms, bringing the stairway into code, retrofitting the electrical, gutting some walls and the addition of a new service area and enlarging the existing building from 1,377 square feet to 2,349 square feet.

Councilman Vittengl explained that the current building is 40 years old and something needs to be done to it. He thought the reason for the one bid was that the project was too small for the big guys and too big for the small guys. He would like to see the project started this fall and completed by springtime. It is long overdue he said.

Councilman Kusnierz said he discussed this with Councilman Vittengl and while retrofitting is a little more expensive the cost to construct a new building would be over \$500,000.00 and probably last only ten years longer. He was concerned over the fact that there was only one bid, but it isn't like we didn't reach out to get more bids. The money is available and the time to do it is now so it can be finished by spring.

Supervisor Jenkins said that Little League was going to contribute \$15,000.00.

Councilman Vittengl said he heard it was \$10,000.00 that they were going to contribute.

Councilman Prendergast stated that he met with Councilman Vittengl at the park today and agreed that the building is in deplorable condition. He strongly supports the renovation of the building or construction of a new one and that the time to act is now. However, only one bid was received and in the past they have rebid projects when only one bid has been received. So for that reason he will have to vote no. If it is put back out to bid and only one bid comes in again then at least they can tell the public that they tried.

Councilwoman LeClair agreed that the building has needed to be taken care of for some time now. However, she can't vote for a project that costs \$110,000.00 to sell hotdogs and hamburgers out of for about two months a year. She mentioned Gavin Park and their concession stand and how they put their money into the facilities that are going to be used a lot longer. Approving this project would be supporting one organization to the tune of \$110,000.00. If the Board approved the expenditure of funds on bleachers or fields it would be easier for her to vote yes on it.

Supervisor Jenkins stated that RFP's were done before on this project and the proposals were in the range of \$85,000.00 to \$135,000.00 and the one for \$85,000.00 was a two person crew and they weren't going to pay prevailing wage. If the building is torn down and a new one built the cost will be double. He said he was prepared to move ahead with this project. He doesn't see bids coming in any less the next time.

Councilman Kusnierz stated that valid comments have been made. He isn't comfortable with one bid, but there is a risk that if they rebid the project then we may not get this one bid back and there is a chance that no one will be willing to do the project. He supports the project and moving ahead with it at this time. He said Councilman Vittengl has done a lot of work on this project so he would leave the honor to him of making the motion to move forward with it.

Councilman Vittengl made the motion to award the bid for the expansion/remodel of the concession stand in the Harry J. Betar Jr. Recreational Park to R & J Kerr per their bid price of \$110,000.00.

CEMETERY CARE – OLMSTED, CARR AND PARK CEMETERIES

Reed Antis submitted a report on Moreau Cemeteries to the Town Board that described the locations of the various cemeteries in Moreau, their condition, restoration work that has taken place and in what cemeteries. He was asking the Town Board to budget a small amount of money in the 2014 Town Budget to purchase some supplies to be used in restoration of headstones. He was also asking for help from the Highway Department to clear paths into some of the remote cemeteries and for the Town's laborer who mows Reynolds, Rice and Griswold Cemeteries now to mow the cemeteries that have been restored and help maintain them. He also asked the Town Board to budget money for a sign to be erected in the Griswold Cemetery.

SCWA SERVICE AREA RESOLUTION

A motion was made by Councilwoman LeClair and seconded by Councilman Vittengl to adopt the following resolution:

WHEREAS, at a regular meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Moreau held on July 23, 2013, the Town Board authorized the Supervisor to execute an Agreement with the Saratoga County Water Authority ("SCWA") to sell water to areas to be served by the Town of Moreau; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board does hereby amend the resolution dated July 23, 2013, authorizing the Supervisor to execute the Agreement and specifically requests SCWA to sell water to the areas to be served by the Town.

Councilman Kusnierz stated that when this issue was approved by the Town Board it was approved by a split vote of 3/2. He said there was discussion that night about this and subsequently there have been discussions and he expressed concerns and asked that negotiations be reopened on the contract with SCWA. He said the contract binds the Town of Moreau to purchasing 100,000 gallons of water per day minimum for 10 years at \$1.00 per 1,000 gallons more than what the Town of Queensbury charges the Town. For this reason he voted no and was going to vote no on this resolution and he hoped that the Town Board would consider reopening the negotiations.

Supervisor Jenkins stated that this past week he received information about a company that may be interested in going into our industrial park and if so they would require the use of about 400,000 gallons of water per day. He said that if we only have the Town of Queensbury for a source of water and if we hit our peak capacity then the Town of Queensbury would not be able to provide us with enough water under the current contract. He also said it doesn't really work out to \$1.00 per 1,000 gallons more than what we are paying Queensbury.

Councilman Kusnierz asked Supervisor Jenkins if he had something in writing from the Town of Queensbury that they can't meet our needs.

Supervisor Jenkins replied no, but 2 million gallons per day is as high as they can go without doing something to the PRV on their side of the river and our water demands have been increasing. If Queensbury had to do a second river crossing it would be very expensive.

APPROVE LOAN TO PAY BILLS ON WATER DISTRICT 1 EXTENSION 1 & 2

Supervisor Jenkins asked for approval to loan money from Water District 4 to Water District 1 Extension 1 & 2 to pay bills from Anjo in the amount of \$221,445.00 and R & J Kerr in the amount of \$73,303.51. EFC has said that once the contract is signed with SCWA they will release the money to the Town. The loan would be repaid to Water District 4 with the same rate of interest that the bank is paying on the money in the Water District 4 account.

Councilman Prendergast asked how long the vouchers have been in and not paid.

Supervisor Jenkins replied about 6 to 8 weeks.

Supervisor Jenkins said he would ask them to attend the next meeting.

15 MINUTE PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD

Bobby Dick asked where the audio sound system was going to be installed and the answer was the Town Meeting Room/Court Room.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Councilman Kusnierz reported that the Crandall Public Library has submitted their proposed 2014 Budget and propositions for the General Election Ballot. He said the Town Board should have received copies by now. He noted that the increase in the tax levy for the Town of Moreau is proposed at 1.64%. The total levy would be \$674,191.00 and that is down from the 2013 levy of \$679,880.00.

The levy for Glens Falls is proposed at \$826,828.00 and Queensbury at \$1,723,208.00.

Councilman Vittengl said he would like to get prices on a multi-purpose building in the Rec. Park near the skating rink that could be used as a warming hut, etc. He would also like to get prices on a cold storage building that would be on a slab to hold equipment. He hoped that by the next meeting he would have prices for the Town Board to review. The Town Board could then decide what direction they wanted to go in.

Councilwoman LeClair and Attorney Buettner spoke about the previous resolution adopted by the Town Board on 6/11/13 that authorized the engagement of the LA Group to draft and obtain easements on property adjacent to river front property to be used for recreational purposes. The resolution was subject to permissive referendum. The referendum period has expired and no petitions were filed. Attorney Buettner said she would be getting a contract to the LA Group this week.

SUPERVISOR'S ITEMS

Supervisor Jenkins said that NYS DOT rejected a request from the Town to lower the speed limit on Route 197 between Route 9 and Route 32 and a request for a no passing zone. Supervisor Jenkins said he was going to call NYS DOT and talk to them about this.

The Town Board previously accepted a quote from Foresight Alarms for an alarm system for the new municipal building, but the motion and second did not include authorization for the Supervisor to sign a contract with Foresight Alarms.
